

Dear Constituents:

The past five months have been a challenge for all of us. The responses to the COVID-19 pandemic from all levels of government have dominated our activities. But I do need to reflect on the priorities I set when you elected me as your Member of Parliament last year. The most important issues I knew I had to focus on in Parliament included:

- 1. Providing an experienced voice to represent our oil and gas industry in a broken policy-making process in Ottawa. See my recommendations to the Minister of Energy on my website: www.GregMcLeanMP.ca/news.
- 2. Ensuring that our fiscal arrangements in Canada were addressed so that Alberta would not continue to transfer taxes to other jurisdictions while our own social services delivery was being marginalized.
- 3. Bringing financial experience to government decision-making and returning some fiscal sanity to Canada's ever-growing debt balance.

Parliament was suspended in March, and is due to return – in some form – on September 21st. This suspension of democracy has severely limited the tools available for the Opposition to hold the Government to account, but we are using the opportunities we have. We identified and pressed the Government to fix many deficiencies in the COVID-19 aid programs – although many inequities remain. We also identified and shone a bright light on how the Government administered these huge programs, including breaches of ethics, conflicts of interest, and apparent favouritism in awarding contracts.

This matters, because spending your tax dollars wisely is an important part of governing. And democracy matters – even in a pandemic.

Please take the time to provide your input on how you feel I am serving the constituents of Calgary Centre. I appreciate your comments, and I look forward to continuing to serve you.

On July 8th, the Ottawa Liberals released a fiscal snapshot that predicts the federal deficit will reach \$343.2 billion for 2020, the net federal debt will surpass \$1 trillion, and government revenues will fall by over \$70 billion. In addition, Canada now has the highest unemployment rate of all G7 countries and is the only G7 country to have lost its AAA credit rating since the pandemic began.
